THE KING'S ORCHARD

In addition to berries, you can pick your own wildflowers near the site of the annual Renaissance Festival. On the way back home, you can enjoy a meal at a great little restaurant in the town of Todd Mission. Ask for directions to the grill at Kings Orchard. It's the perfect end to a day of picking! Bring bug spray, sunscreen, a hat, and a change of clothes during blueberry season when it is extremely hot. Open Tuesday through Sunday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., during picking season. Strawberries cost \$3.35 per pound, blackberries \$3.50 per pound, blueberries \$3.40 per pound, and figs \$4.50 per pound. Flowers cost \$9. Call ahead to reserve for field trips and large groups.

With 33 acres of planted blackberries, figs, jujube (Asian dates), Asian pears, Asian persimmons and citrus, Matt Family Orchard provides facilities for group outings and offers fun educational tours for schools, church groups and other organizations. They even have evening hayrides and sing alongs by the campfire for all ages. Fruit picking hours are 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., but hours are seasonal depending on fruit availability.

Located off of Highway 290, Black Berries of Houston grows thornless blackberries on trellises from mid-May through June. With over seven acres of raised blackberries, they also provide a beautiful pond, rose garden, and a root cellar for you to tour. Have some family fun by picking your own berries and making your own blackberry cobblers and pies topped with ice cream. Don't forget your hat and water to drink! Open seven days a week from 7 a.m. to noon. Accepts cash only.

Open from late May through mid-July, Moorhead's Blueberry Farm is the first commercially operated blueberry farm in Texas. With 20 acres of land and over 20 different varieties of blueberries, Moorhead's does not use pesticides. You can pick these blueberries from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. during any given day of the week. With only \$3 per child, bring a group of your child's friends and let them enjoy a fun day picking and snacking on this delicious fruit! Moorhead's charges \$1.50 per pound of picked blueberries and accepts cash or check only.

Pick your own peaches, nectarines, and blackberries at this small, friendly, family owned orchard. With nearly 1,000 fruit trees, E&B Orchard in Hempstead is a great get-a-way from the city. Open daily from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. from mid-May thru mid-July. Yellow peaches cost \$1.74 per pound, white peaches \$2 per pound, blackberries \$3 per pound, and white nectarines \$2 per pound. Be sure to call before coming due to fruit availability. SLM
